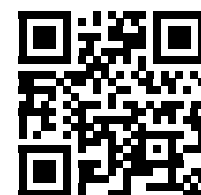

Take a dynamic, **multilayered** and flexible approach to learning about the **cultures, economies, languages, politics and societies** of Latin America with the **Bachelor of Arts in Latin American Studies** in Temple University's College of Liberal Arts.

Explore Latin America as a crucial global framework and as a strategic player, delving deep into pivotal issues such as U.S.-Latin America foreign relations, U.S. Latinx studies, immigrant experiences, race and ethnicity formation, social movements and more. Courses are offered in departments from every school and college, and our affiliated faculty research diverse topics from development economics to immigrant healthcare, from Latin American music to colonial literature. Our students become true experts who can speak to a wide range of issues confronting Latin America and contribute proactively to development and cooperation as well as to business and political analysis.

## AN IMMERSIVE EXPERIENCE

Students of Latin American Studies have the opportunity to participate in the Latin American Studies Semester (LASS) program, through the Department of Spanish & Portuguese. In this program, students take classes only in the target language and study abroad together for several weeks in a Latin American country.

There is also the opportunity to study in Latin America for more than one semester. Our interdisciplinary program means that most credits taken through approved study abroad programs will apply toward graduation. Recent graduates have studied in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Guatemala, Mexico and Peru.
