PHILOSOPHY

Philosophy raises fundamental questions about ourselves and the world, sharpening the perception of the value of our lives and an increasing the ability to analyze. Learn to think critically about the world and its complexities and to study life's most difficult questions with the **Bachelor of Arts in Philosophy**.

Philosophy explores life's big questions—questions about knowledge, existence, and value. Coursework for the Philosophy Major covers contemporary philosophy, the history of philosophy, philosophy of race and gender, and pure and applied philosophy. Our students learn to employ philosophical ideas and methods to critically assess claims and arguments in a wide range of fields

Whatever your interests, the department offers relevant courses and outstanding faculty members. Our course offerings cover some of the following key areas: aesthetics, ancient philosophy, early modern philosophy, ethics, philosophy of race, philosophy of language, Kant/post-Kantian European philosophy and other forms of social diversity.

If you plan on **going to law school**, our department offers a **BA in Philosophy with a Pre-Law Emphasis**. The curriculum lays the foundation for law school, with relevant coursework to help prepare students for the LSAT test and admission to graduate programs.
