CJ 3000 – Police and Investigative Psychology

Course description: For those interested in forensic psychology, this class is a must. This is because Psychology has myriad influences on the way policing is done in the United States, including the selection of law enforcement officers, methods for de-escalating situations

involving the seriously mentally ill, programs for decreasing police stress and suicide, fitness for duty evaluations, interrogations, and hostage negotiations. Forensic psychology also has several investigative methods for helping police solve cases. Investigation tools include criminal psychological profiling, psychological autopsies, lie-detectors (i.e., polygraph), and hypnosis. The class takes a balanced look at each of these topics, presenting both the positives and negatives about each.

CJ 4097 – Criminal Justice Capstone Course

Course description: This topical seminar focuses on a broad topic of interest within Criminal Justice. The specific content will vary with individual instructors. This is a writing-intensive course designed to integrate knowledge and critical thinking skills developed in the major. Each seminar will focus upon analysis and synthesis of scholarly sources, culminating in an independent research paper. This course is required for all CJ majors and must be taken during the senior year

Special Topics Taught: Title (Semester)

Psychology, Crime, & Rehabilitation Psychology of Corrections

CJ 2601 -- Introduction to Criminal Justice Research(Curriculum Revised, see CJ 2597) *Course description*: Examines different research tools used to gather empirical information on criminal justice issues. Reviews benchmarks of scientific quality, and research tools like qualitative field methods, survey research, experiments, quasi-experiments, and career research. Special attention devoted to research problems often salient when researching criminal justice topics.

CJ 2597 - Criminal Justice Research Methods (see CJ 2601) - Writing Intensive

Course description: Introduces the scientific method and research designs including qualitative field methods, survey research, experiments, and quasi-experiments. Evaluation of research quality and synthesis of research evidence related to criminal justice issues emphasized. Special attention devoted to research problems often salient when researching criminal justice topics.

CJ 2602 – Criminal Justice Statistic (formerly Criminal Justice Research and Analysis)

Course description: Introduction to basic statistical methods and their application to criminal justice data. Covers both descriptive and inferential statistics. Topics include frequency distributions, measures of central tendency and dispersion, and basic hypothesis testing

CJ 4403 -- Psychology and Criminal Justice, Relabeled to CJ 3408; Retitled Forensic Psychology

Course description: The contribution of psychology to our understanding of various aspects of and decisions within the criminal justice process. The psychological implications of criminal behavior, criminal justice decision-making, jury selection, witness recall, sentencing, prisonization, and correctional treatment.

CJ W2696 -- Planned Change,

Course description: This course provides an introduction to strategies and techniques of change in criminal justice. Important theories, methods of analysis, and techniques employed in

changing individuals, organizations, and communities are discussed. This course is open to criminal justice majors only.

CJ 590 -- Advanced Seminar in Criminal Justice Research,

Course description: This advanced issues in criminal justice research course emphasizes the application of multivariate analytic techniques that are increasingly more commonly found in criminal justice research. The multivariate analytic techniques that will be discussed, including logistic regression, logit and probit analyses, survival analysis, cluster analysis, and discriminant analysis.

CJ 602 -- Graduate Methods II, (Relabeled to CJ 8302 Advanced Methods and Issues in Criminal Justice Research)

Course description: The course offers a broad coverage of social science research issues comprising philosophical, theoretical and methodological perspectives. Its goal is to prepare students to examine each of these aspects of research and to develop competency and applied skills across a wide range of methodological approaches. The course emphasizes the fact that research can be shaped by many different paradigms each of which can utilize one or more of the wide array of available methodologies. Emphasizes the 'how to' of research rather than a more abstract discussion of topics. It incorporates tools and techniques used in both quantitative and qualitative approaches and requires students to engage in practical research design, development and analysis. The course is presented at an advanced level and assumes that students have a solid grounding in basic research methods. Students will be required to use computer packages such as SPSS and Excel.

CJ 8330 -- Seminar in Advanced Criminal Justice Research, The Influence of the Individual on Criminal Justice Interventions

Course description: Effective criminal justice program design requires careful consideration of the offenders who will be served by the intervention. Some of the <u>individual characteristics</u> manifested by them are directly related to the problem or need the program is designed to address while others have less direct, but still meaningful influences on program outcomes. Theoretical frameworks such as the Transtheoretical Model of Behavioral Change will be used to examine the influence of offender characteristics on both the processes and outcomes of a number of criminal justice interventions focused on offender behavior, including problem-solving courts, DUI interventions, criminal thinking and morality programs, sex offender programs, and batterer-intervention programs. <u>Meta-analyses</u> will be a primary reading source, and this will be accompanied by an introduction to the methodology behind the meta-analytic approach to aggregating information from multiple primary studies.

CJ 8101 – Decision Making in Criminal Justice,

Course description: Criminological theory and the operation of the criminal justice system how we understand crime and how society responds to crime - are inextricably linked. This course focuses on how society's formal system responds to crime and criminals. Even this emphasis can be understood as a subset of actions, problems and issues that are dealt with both formally and informally under the heading of security or maintaining social order or rehabilitation. The course selectively focuses on examining the response to crime by the criminal justice system and its staff, as well as legislators and policy makers. How are crime policies and procedures developed and implemented, why and how are decisions made, and what are the problems, issues and implications regarding those efforts? This course focuses on "decision making" and on the exercise of discretion that shapes decision making on many levels. On a broader level we can think about decision making in criminal justice as involving the formulation of policy, for example, by laws, legislature, and administrative decision making—which boils down to the exercise of discretionary authority to make of decisions: How should police be deployed? When should force be employed? How should judges decide at various stages of proceedings? What penalties should be affixed to various criminal acts? How does a parole board make liberty decisions for people who have been convicted and confined? On a second, narrower level, this focus on the exercise of discretion in decision making involves the actions of individual actors and understanding their body of decisions at the various stages of the criminal process. This informs us of the implementation of criminal justice in practice, within the guidelines, standards, laws or rules of the system.
