Course focused on the studies of Latin American and Mexican feminism in the hopes of understanding better the spike in gender violence and femicide in the country. Held at the Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México. As a final essay, I submitted “Pintas, colonialidad y transfobia, hacia un análisis de los hechos ocurridos en el Edo. Mex y CDMX” [Graffiti, colonialism, and transphobia: an analysis on Mexico City and Mexico State current affairs]. Where I studied the notions of gender in Indigenous communities before and after the Spanish conquer and discussed how they should be taken into account when talking about women and feminine bodies in México, so we could better understand trans-femicides and transphobic violence.

Seminar focused on the study of violence across different philosophical traditions and perspectives. Held at the Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México. The final work included an essay on urban violence and how the lack of access to certain cultural spaces, such as museums, cinemas, libraries, and universities, constituted an act of violence on the population of the outskirts of Mexico City and México State.

Seminar focused on the different critiques that collectives, artists, and academics themselves have done against the institutionalization of art and structures such as galleries, private collections, and museums. As a final work, I submitted an essay on “Sonideros” (a cultural practice in México consisting of collectives that play cumbias and salsas and organize dances in the public street) and defended why they should be considered art and the function they have in building communities for underprivileged populations.
